CONSTITUTIONAL QUESTION

"Shall the Constitution of the State be amended to permit the General Assembly to allow each voter to vote by absentee ballot?"

A YES vote on this amendment will give the General Assembly the ability to change the state constitution to allow all voters to vote by absentee ballot without providing an excuse, or reason. A NO vote means current regulations remain.

All voting takes place in person at town hall at 41 Kent Green Blvd. unless by absentee ballot. Only US citizens at least 18 years of age can vote in US elections.

Mail: postmarked by this date DMV: by end of business day Online: by 11:59 p.m. In person: by 8 p.m.
